Next year we turn 10 years old! We have an amazing TCFF planned for you and you won't want to miss a minute of it—so mark your calendars now for July 29-August 3, 2014. More movies, more stars, more fudge. What could be better when you're 10?!

This year's festival marks a milestone for TCFF: we're finally opening a much-needed second screen for the State Theatre, which was just named the number one theater in the world by the Motion Picture Association of America!

We're restoring the Con Foster museum in Clinch Park, an 80-year-old (and long vacant) building originally built by President Roosevelt's Civil Works Administration—with the same loving care and with the same team that resurrected the State Theatre in 2007. TCFF9 audiences will be the first to enjoy movies in our new venue, which we're calling the Bijou ("BE-zhu," the French word for "small gem"). Then we'll finish up the job in August, and open year-round on Labor Day weekend with a community celebration and open house.

The Bijou by the Bay will be a unique and wonderful place to see a movie, and will greatly enhance the moviegoing experience in Northern Michigan while making things infinitely better for the State Theatre, too. The Bijou means more foreign movies, more documentaries, more obscure (but great) works, more classics and more programs for students and local non-profits, at both the State and the Bijou. The possibilities are endless and exciting!


FREE FESTIVAL LOOP
